On March 8, the residents of Coppet demonstrated strong engagement in the municipal elections.

In the Communal Council, **ECDC** secured 20 seats, joined by 6 seats from **Coppet Autrement**, thanks to the electoral alliance formed for these elections.

IN TOTAL, THIS RESULT ACCOUNTS FOR 47% OF THE VOTES CAST.

The voters of Coppet sent a clear and decisive message during the municipal elections on March 8. Yet, 3 of the 5 seats in the Municipality are already held by representatives of the majority group. This is why we are presenting two candidates, Christine Villemot and Vincent Moret, to help ensure a balanced Municipality in Coppet.

A New Generation of Commitment for Coppet



Christine Villemot

Married for 23 years and the mother of two children, I have lived in Coppet for the past twenty years. I hold a Master's degree in Management from Paris-Dauphine University and worked for several major international IT companies before choosing Coppet for its exceptional quality of life, its village-scale atmosphere, and its proximity to the airport, which was essential for my professional travel.

When my children were born, I chose to devote myself fully to their upbringing. Now that they are older, I want to dedicate my energy to serving our community. Deeply involved in school life, I served as a parents' representative on the school council and am an active member of the APEJ. I contributed in particular to limiting mobile phone use on school premises and improving safety around nearby railway crossings. These commitments have allowed me to better understand the needs of families and to take concrete action to support the well-being of children.

I joined the ECDC because of its dynamism, openness, and its commitment to valuing good ideas wherever they come from. My aim in joining the Municipality is to strengthen the connection between residents and local authorities. I want to improve communication, encourage participation and promote transparency, for example, by publishing the waiting list for the marina berth, as well as for childcare places and after-school programs.

Friendly and approachable, I look forward to speaking with everyone who contributes to the life of our village, so that together we can continue to make Coppet a welcoming, vibrant, and enjoyable place for all generations.



Vincent Moret

A resident of Coppet since 1998, I grew up here and chose to build my life here with my partner. Deeply committed to my community, I became involved in public life by joining the Communal Council at the age of 20, with the desire to actively contribute to Coppet's future.

Over the years, I have focused on improving quality of life, public spaces, safety and local taxation. For example, I proposed improvements to the harbor café, strengthened security around the train station, and opposed the cantonal fiscal equalization system, which places a heavy burden on Coppet's finances (a position later supported by 32 other municipalities).

Convinced that our municipality should move forward with more energy and vision, I co-founded the ECDC (Centre-Right Alliance of Coppet) with three fellow citizens in 2021. Since then, our movement has become an essential voice in local debate, driven by new ideas and a clear commitment to advancing Coppet with transparency and dynamism.


Professionally, after studying law, I founded a home delivery company in the Geneva region. Today, I am a partner in a communications firm and co-founder of [stoody.ch](https://www.stoody.ch), a pass designed for students in French-speaking Switzerland.

My candidacy for the Municipality is a natural continuation of my public service: advancing concrete projects for Coppet and contributing to modern, dynamic, and responsible governance.

The Priorities Shared by Coppet Residents

To better understand the needs of its residents, the ECDC conducted a survey among the people of Coppet.

The responses expressed by more than 415 participants are clear and highlight five major priorities for the future of the municipality.



1) Security

We will install video surveillance cameras near the train station and in certain parking areas, and we will work to reduce burglary rates by developing **patrols and rapid interventions with a dedicated security service**. We also aim to improve prevention, particularly for seniors, to protect against the growing threat of **cybercrime**.



2) Taxation and Public Finances

We are committed to **sustainably balancing the municipal finances without increasing taxes**, as the municipality should not have to rely on exceptional revenues to cover its expenses. We also want the residents of Coppet to benefit, in one way or another, from **a fair redistribution of the 40 million francs in transfer taxes received by the municipality**.

3) Heritage and Urban Planning

We want to implement **a clear urban planning vision** for the next two decades, ensuring Coppet remains **a human-scale municipality**. We must defend harmonious development **without densification imposed** by the canton. We will propose a comprehensive **project for the Coppet harbor (including a restaurant, if the residents wish) and for Place du Four, designed to enhance these spaces and strengthen local commerce.**



4) Leisure and Public Spaces

We will accelerate the development of **a synthetic sports field** near the schools, enabling **local sports clubs** to expand their activities. We also want to **prioritize access to the "Rocailles" area for the benefit of Coppet residents** and develop **winter activities** there.



5) Children, Youth and Education

To better meet the growing needs of families, we will work closely with the APEJ to **develop school and extracurricular infrastructures** (daycare and UAPE). We also want to reintroduce end-of-year celebrations and extend them to other times of the year, strengthening **the connection between schools, families and village life.**

A necessary balance for Coppet

On March 8, the residents of Coppet expressed a clear desire for diversity and a rebalancing of local political forces.

With 47% of the votes, the momentum led by **ECDC** and **Coppet Autrement** showed that a significant share of residents wishes to see a new balance and renewed energy for Coppet.

The second round on March 29 will make it possible to confirm this momentum and strengthen the institutional balance of our municipality. By electing Christine Villemot and Vincent Moret, the residents of Coppet will contribute to a Municipality that is representative, open and attentive to the expectations of its residents.

On March 29, two seats are to be filled in the Municipality. To support this initiative, we invite you to write the following names on your ballot:
